Jack V. Drury, entered into rest on Thursday, August 3, 2006 at the age of 84. He was born on October 14, 1921 in Brownwood, Texas. The youngest of eight children, four brothers and four sisters. Jack was preceded in death by all his siblings and his wife of forty-six years, Gladys Drury. He is survived by his daughters, Jo Nell D. King and husband J.B. of San Antonio and Connie L. His most notable and successful business was that of his Bingo Operations for Charitable Organizations. Three of which are still operating today. Jack was also involved with numerous charitable benefits for local and around South Texas orphanages, such as, The Flour Bluff V.F.D., Corpus Christi, Texas. In 1966, Jack founded the V.F.W. Post 8397, of which he was a life member. He was also a member of the Army Masonic Lodge for forty-one years, and a member of the Alzar Shrine Temple for thirty-nine years.
