James Warren Jackson was born May 7, 1929 in Salem, Illinois to Harry James Jackson and Bess Small. He passed on from this life to eternal glory on September 28, 2016. The Jackson family moved to Chicago, Illinois when he was around four years of age. His father worked for the Illinois railroad as an office clerk.

Mr. Jackson graduated from Parker High School and Woodrow Wilson Junior College in Chicago, Illinois. He then attended the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, Illinois. During the Korean War, he served our country as a U.S. Army Corporal in a combat engineering unit.

After the war, he received Jesus Christ as his Savior and Lord. In 1954 he enrolled in Manhattan Bible College and graduated in 1959. He was ordained into the ministry at Englewood Church of Christ (Christian Church) in Chicago, Illinois in 1956.
