JAMES EVERETT McDONALD, 88, was born in Junction City, KS on October 25, 1919 and passed away peacefully surrounded by his family, June 26, 2008. James was a resident of San Antonio for 59 years. A devoted husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather, James was preceded by his beloved wife of 57 years, Mildred Francis McDonald in 2000, his parents, Everett James and Anna Madge Zollinger McDonald, and sister, Emily Ann McDonald Reich. He leaves to cherish his memory daughters, Frances Anne McDonald and Linda K. Kissling Paul; grandsons, Allen James Moczygemba Alexandria and Lance Corporal USMC Matthew Stephen Moczygemba Sarah and great-grandchildren, Mikaela Marie Moczygemba and Matthew Steven Moczygemba. James is survived by nephew, George James Reich and other nieces and nephew. He enjoyed spending time with family and many extended family members. He will be missed by all.

During World War II., James served his country, in the Army Air Corp, being stationed in the Aleutian Islands. He was then transferred to Randolph AFB., to begin pilot training. While in San Antonio, he met his future wife, at the USO. A service physical revealed a severe medical condition, due to his exposure to extreme cold temperatures. This resulted in his having a lobectomy and a 9 month hospitalization at BAMC. James was medically discharged in Oct. 1943, attaining the rank of Sergeant. After 36 years as a

Federal Civil Service employee, he retired from Kelly AFB, in 1979. After his retirement from Kelly, James and Mildred enjoyed traveling extensively, throughout the United States, including several trips to Alaska and Canada in their RV. James and Mildred enjoyed many RV trips with Roadrunner and Retirees Good Sam Clubs. James was a long-time member of Highland Terrance United Methodist Church, and member of Jefferson United Methodist Church, for the last 8 years. At Jefferson United Methodist Church, James was very active in the "Lunch Bunch." James was a Life Member of Highland Hills Lodge #1373 A.F. & A.M., a 32o Degree Mason of the Scottish Rite and a Noble of Alzafar Shrine Temple. He was also a member the Highland Hills Chapter #1075, Order of the Eastern Star.
