James Jim Edward O'Gorman, our much loved husband, father, grandfather and brother passed away on Wednesday August 4, 2010 at the age of 68. He was born July 28, 1942 in Brooklyn, New York, to Thomas and Eleanor O'Gorman. Jim was a veteran of the U.S. Air Force, serving in Vietnam as an Aerial Gunner and Crew Chief on an UH1F Helicopter, assigned to the 20th Special Operations Squadron "Green Hornets". He was awarded the purple Heart with 1 Oak Leaf Cluster, National Defense Service Medal, Presidential Unit Citation, Republic of Vietnam Campaign, Vietnam Service Medal with 3 Battle Stars, Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Good Conduct Medal with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters. Jim honorably retired as a Master Sergeant in San Antonio, in 1980. He is survived by his wife Sharron O'Gorman; his children Shawn and Heather O'Gorman of Bulverde, Jason O'Gorman and Carol Grothues of Dripping Springs; Step-Children Clayton and Melissa Sowell of San Antonio, Rayleen Watson of Louisville; his grandchildren Carly, Shawn Jr., and Hailey; his brothers Thomas O'Gorman, Andy and Lana Paparella; and other siblings. Visitation will be Monday, Aug. 9 from 6-8 pm and Funeral Services will be Tuesday, Aug. 10 at 9:00 am; both will be at Mission Park North Funeral Chapels. Interment will follow at Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery at 10:45 am.
