James Carter Rosser passed into eternal life on March 20, 2011. He was born on February 9, 1924 in Rogers, Texas to Era Willie Rosser and Maggie McDowell Rosser. He joined the Army in 1940 and while stationed in San Antonio he met Alma Ripps. They were married on November 15, 1942. He was a veteran of WWII and saw combat on D-Day and at the Battle of the Bulge. After the war he worked for the Missouri Pacific Railroad, first as a switchman and later a yardmaster. At his retirement in 1984, it was the Union Pacific. His membership in the UTU spans 65 years. After retirement he and Alma traveled often to Las Vegas, and other parts of the USA. Their marriage spanned almost 50 years. After her death he spent 7 years in a loving relationship with Helen Wyble who also predeceased him. He lived the last 10 years of his life at the home of his daughter where he was surrounded by his grandchildren and later, his great-grandchildren. James is survived by his daughter Marilyn and her husband Alvin Ritchey, by his granddaughters Jennifer, Susanne, and Amanda and her husband Ryan Key, and by his great-grandchildren Liam, Sophia, Wyatt, and Nikolas. He is also survived by a sister, Melba Jones, a brother, Bob Rosser and numerous nieces and nephews throughout Texas.
