He was awarded the American Theater Campaign Metal, Eame Campaign Medal with two Bronze Stars, Good Conduct Medal, Bronze Star Medal and the World War 2 Victory Medal. After being honorably discharged in February 1946, and returned to work at Southwestern Bell until he retired in October 1988 after 46 years of dedicated service. He was also a Masonic member in the early part of his life.

Rocky loved people and in his final years was even adored by all at the care facility he resided at.
