Jane Craighead Dunning Dahlberg went to be with the Lord on May 28, 2007 at the age of 93. Jane graduated from Old Main Avenue High School in 1931. She became treasurer for the Old Main Avenue High School Reunion Group. Jane was a member and considered to be the “First Lady” of the Chinese American Composite Wing that formed after World War II.
