M. Jane Cole was born on September 16, 1933 in Pittsburgh, PA and passed away on November 13, 2018. . She was preceded in death by her husband of 55 years Hugh Walter Hamlyn; her parents John Inkstar Cole and Anna Katharine McClure Cole; her brother Albert Page Cole; her son Hugh Walter Hamlyn, and grandson Michael McClure Hamlyn. She is survived by her son Jeffrey Hamlyn and wife Vickie, grandsons Walter Hamlyn and wife Erin and Geoffrey Hamlyn. Also survived by brothers Peter Cole (Sue), John Cole (Carol), sister-in-law Charlotte Cole and several nieces and nephews. Jane attended elementary school in Chicago followed by high school in Madison, WI. She received her B.S. degree in Physical Therapy from the University of WI, and later her M.S. degree from the University of IA. She joined the Air Force while a senior P.T. student at the U.W. After graduation she served at WHMC San Antonio and Tachikawa, Japan from 1955-60. She met her future husband, Hugh, while at WHMC, and after a long distance courtship they were married in Evanston, IL. Hugh was stationed at Maxwell AFB, Montgomery, AL where their sons Hugh Walter and Jeffrey McClure were born. Hugh was transferred to Wiesbaden Hospital. In Germany, the whole family enjoyed touring Europe and Volksmarching 5&10km walks on the weekends. In 1975 in Metz, France, Jane & Hugh ran the first of many marathons. After Hugh retired in 1977 and returned to San Antonio, Jane

worked for 22 years at the VA Hospital before retiring as Director of Physical Therapy in 2000. She touched many lives in volunteering and leisure activities. She was a member of Colonial Hills UMC, a Life member of the PTA and American Physical Therapy assoc., a charter member of the San Antonio Roadrunners, and a member of the American Volkspport Association. She especially enjoyed attending her grandsons' activities, volunteering at Castle Hills Elementary and Jackson Middle School, and delivering Meals on Wheels. Jane had many hobbies; walking and jogging with friends, competing in various runs, playing Mah Jongg and Bridge, and antique shopping.
