The Holy Spirit of our Lord, Jesus Christ placed Jesse Varela Mancillas into the palm of His hand and took him Home on December 11, 2007. The little boy born on January 4, 1921 to Luis and Refugio Mancillas, who fled the Mexican Revolution of 1910, grew up on the Westside of San Antonio, survived the Depression, and went on to participate in much of the history of the United States during the twentieth century. Jesse enlisted into the U.S. Army in 1941 where he protected us, along with millions of others during World War II at Rvukyus, Aleutian Islands, Alaska and Okinawa as the Enola Gay passed over him on its way to Japan. He later served in Korea and in Vietnam as a Medic. In 1968 he served his first tour of duty in Vietnam with his eldest son. Jesse also served in France and Germany with the N.A.T.O. forces and also at the Berlin Wall. He was preceded in death by his baby daughter, Dolores. Jesse leaves behind his beloved and only wife of 63 years, Mary Bononcini Mancillas; 3 daughters, Sylvia B. Mancillas, Gilda M. Pelak John, Arlette M. Padilla Darryl; 3 sons, Jesse B. Mancillas Elida, Rudy B. Mancillas Sylvia, Rick B. Mancillas Monica; 15 grandchildren; 8 great-grandchildren; 2 nieces; and 2 nephews.
