Jesse A. Olivarri joined the Lord on January 15, 2021.

He was born on October 29, 1940 in San Antonio, Texas. He graduated from Harlandale High School after attending Central Catholic High School for two years; he served in the Army from 1962 to 1965; and worked in the shoe business for many years, the majority of which were at Thom McAn. A faithful parishioner of St. Paul Catholic Church, Jesse was extremely active with the Knights of Columbus (KC) Council 7265. He served in many roles, including Grand Knight, and was a member of the Fourth Degree Assembly 2764.

Jesse also volunteered his time at St. Paul as a money counter and usher and coordinated many KC fundraisers over the years. The St. Paul community was like a second family to him and he treasured the many friends he made throughout the years.

Jesse enjoyed watching and playing golf, grilling, tending to his plants, looking for antiques at flea markets and garage sales, watching the Cowboys play, and spending time with his family. Jesse was kind, patient, witty, generous, and always willing to lend a hand. He was a wonderful man who will be deeply missed.

Jesse is survived by his beloved wife of 51 years, Delia A. Olivarri; daughter, Roxanne Yvette; son, Jesse Rene (Stacie); granddaughter, Corynne Olivarri; brother, Jerry Olivarri; and brother-in-law, Gilbert Arias.
