John (Jack) Seymour Brearley, Jr., 78, of Boerne, Texas went home to be with our Lord on Monday, November 8, 2021. Jack was born in Louisiana and was a San Antonio/Boerne resident for 50 years. Before coming to San Antonio, he served in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam war in the 7th Psyop Battalion where he received the National Defense Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Two Overseas Bars, and the Vietnam Campaign Medal. He continued his military service through 1975 when he received an honorable discharge as a Captain. Following his military service, he worked at Kelly AFB as a Mechanical Engineer and Supervisor for 30 years in the Aircraft Division. He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Geraldine Tello Brearley; his sons, Stephen (Jennifer), Robert (Jennifer), and John III; his brother, Charles (Patricia); his four grandchildren Eleanor, Lauren, John IV, and Wyatt and numerous nieces and nephews. The family will receive visitors from 6 to 8 PM and the Prayer Service to begin at 7 PM at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North on Thursday, November 18, 2021. A graveside service will be held at Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery on Wednesday, December 1, 2021, at 1:15 PM.
