



John H. "Bub" Mauldin, Jr.

John H. "Bub" Mauldin, Jr., passed away Monday, March 12, 2018, at his home in San Antonio, Texas at the age of 94. Bub is survived by his wife, Evelyn, of 73 years who he fell in love with in high school in Utopia, Texas and adored with all of his heart.

Bub and Evelyn were married June 23, 1944, during World War II. Bub proudly served in the 56th Engineer Squadron of the U.S Army, stationed in Guam. After the war, Bub and Evelyn moved back to Utopia, where he was involved with founding the Park Association, which hosted the Utopia Rodeos. He loved baseball and played with the Highway 90 League. He coached baseball for 8 years at the YMCA.

In 1954, they moved to San Antonio. Bub was a successful roofing contractor, member of the Oak Hills Church of Christ, a member of the Quarter Horse Association, and a fifty year Master Mason of the Masonic Lodge. He had a passion for Team Roping and raising Quarter Horses and hunting with his children and grandchildren. The past several years, he enjoyed deer hunting with four generations of his family. Bub played the fiddle in bands throughout high school, and as a lifelong fan of western swing music was honored as an Inductee in the Western Swing Hall of Fame.

Bub was a Fifth Generation Texan, a descent of an original pioneer of the Republic of Texas, and a true master of story-telling. Bub was a true "Texas Cowboy" who loved to give to others and to make people laugh.

Bub is survived by his wife, Evelyn; his children, Linda Burk and husband Billy,
