July 19, 1920 - May 8, 2005

Burton John W. "Jay" Burton born July 19, 1920 in Bradley, Arkansas went to be with the Lord on May 8, 2005 at the age of 84. John was a 37-year veteran of the San Antonio Police Department, a devote Baptist of Trinity Baptist Church, and a veteran of World War II. He served under command of General George S. Patton, Jr. and was assigned to the 80th Infantry Division, The Blue Ridge Mountain Division. John engaged in three major battles, which were Northern France, The Rhineland, and Central Europe. He received the Purple Heart for gun shot wounds received at Metz France, on November 15, 1944. Other medals include the American Theater Campaign Medal, The EAMR Campaign Medal with three Bronze Stars; the Good Conduct Medal, and the Victory Medal. John was preceded in death by his youngest son, Linden A. Burton; brother, H.P. Burton; and a half-brother. He is survived by his loving wife, Joyce J. Burton; two sons, Glynn Jay Burton, Ronald Gene Burton; 4 grandchildren; 5 great grandchildren; sister, Ruth Basile; and one half-sister.
