He had a full and purposeful life during the “dash”, as he called it, between his birth on August 2, 1936 and his passing on May 15, 2025. From there Joe founded CASA Physicians Alliance, a very thriving, prosperous business which he and Andi grew into a legacy for the family. Anyone who knew him also knows how he loved to play golf and was quite good at it. He golfed up until just two months before his passing.

But above all, those who knew him would say that his greatest achievements were how he served God by passionately taking care of his family, friends, neighbors, church and even strangers.
