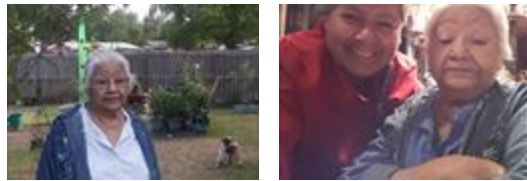

“ My mother was a very hard working tiny lady, she was strong even till the end. She loved her family her sisters her two brothers and she loved her husband and her 5 children! Her hobbies were sewing, embroidery she made many , many , many dish towels, she embroidered several 52'x70' table clothes gave them as gifts, pillow cases, dresser dollies, she like to unsew new blouse collars and sleeves the sides and remake the blouse to her liking. She loved to cook, when I was little she wrote to My Aunt Sofie asked her how to make tamales at the time there was no recipe because my grandma had the recipe in her brain, no measurements of any kind, so between them both and with the help of my grandma they put it on paper and my Aunt sent it to Fort Ord California where we were stationed. They were good as little kids would know the difference! The whole house was decorated from the top to the bottom of the Christmas tree to paper garland, honey comb red bells, to wall decals it was one of our best! We traveled to Fort Gulick Panama where at 8am every day monkeys would give her her wake up call for 3 years, to White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico she loved it there so much her kitchen window had the best site snow covered mountains in the winter and beautiful sunsets! We settled here on the Southside in 1974 and all us kids went to Bob Hope Elementary and on to SouthWest the Original school. My mom loved flowers, roses, cooking, baking, cookies, cakes for our birthdays and fruit cakes for christmas everyone looked foward to that cake those were the best! Everything she made was delicious! I started gardening about 2010 everything I grew is organic she loved that I was growing vegetables and she used them best for her was the Big Bertha Bell Peppers there of course Red! She'd make stuffed bell peppers either with hamburger meat or a sirloin! She loved green beans so we'd clean them and our next meal they they were, my mother gave me tips, pointers, on how my grandmother would grow her own vegetables. Before her passing we were waiting on some crimson watermelons my first time growing a successful small crop (so far only 3) lol we have Jalapeños heirloom, purple, red, yellow, green bell peppers, Malabar spinach, kale, basil, pepper mint, boston cucumber, just a small amount of plants. On the day she

died all her hibiscus flowered she had been waiting for them, her purple morning glories were blooming. We have been so lucky and thankful that our Mother was here for so long some people in this world don't get that. My mom would say she wasn't a perfect person but I say this she was so very near that! Her pains are over now it's time for her to be happy I know we are happy for her! I was missing my mom before this day came and my silly stories I will still tell her in the garden and she will listen to me just like she always did! I LOVE ALWAYS FOREVER, TILL I SEE YOU AGAIN!

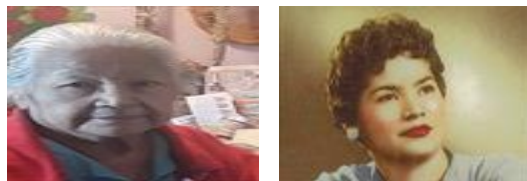
