The love and care in her ministry helped bring all together as the Body of Christ. Juanita was employed at Edgewood Independent School District in various capacities until finally working in administration as a secretary to the principal. She retired after 30 years of service with the Edgewood Independent School District. Upon her retirement, she attended the Oblate School of Theology to earn her certification to teach religious studies at St. Jude Catholic Church which was near and dear to her heart.

She was a powerful force behind her family and she was supportive in every way possible. She enjoyed singing, gardening, crocheting and sewing. Her greatest and favorite patron saint was the Virgen of Guadalupe. She believed in the "Communion of Saints", the spiritual union between the living on earth and the saints in heaven. She often called on Our Lady asking her to intercede on her behalf to God.

Juanita believed strongly in the Power of Prayer and raised all her children

and grandchildren with same beliefs. She was an incredible person, loved by so many and her story will go on. She had a beautiful life and her family and friends will cherish all the memories made.

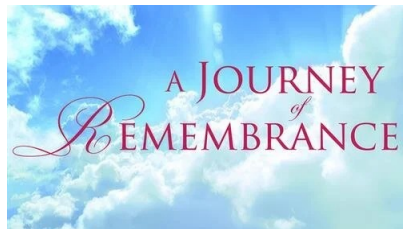
