What sorrow I have for myself and Bud and Red and Joy and Joe, that we will no longer have you here with us. But how joyful I am that you are now enjoying your new, 20-year-old body-free from wracking pain, free to be able to run nimbly and to walk through the garden and bend over to enjoy the scent of flowers that you love and have your beloved doves to come nestle in your hands.

Brother Mick Boley was watching for you, his best friend's wife, to greet you in Christian love. When Mick crossed the veil, you told me how Red would sit in his chair holding a picture of Mick and weep. Red, they are with Brother Branham, who was also watching for his faithful sister in Christ Jesus and along with Brother Billy Paul, Sister Hope and Sister Meda and all the saints that have gone on before, they are enjoying one another's fellowship.

With Bud recovering from chemo and withdrawal from these horrible drugs they had him on for the bone cancer pain and me bedridden for the last 3 months from congestive heart issues, I missed calling for our every-few months catch up call. The last couple times I talked to you were while you were in the hospital and the last call when you'd just come home from there.

Remember when we first met after services at the church in Thayer, Mo where Bro. Paul Brewer pastored? Red had stayed home to fix something at the house and when Mick asked if he could help and you said yes, Mick went straightaway to help Red. And that is how our wonderful friendship began.

Joy came to spend the night with me once when Mick was out of town. Mick took Joe fishing when Red was out of town. Remember the restful time you and I were having sitting in the woods on a log by the river and we saw that snake and decided he could have the log? Ah! Wildlife. But we also enjoyed tubing down the river and it was the first time I'd ever seen a hummingbird resting on a tree

branch-no whirring wings, just peacefully at rest. Such beauty... How smart and intelligent you were, working for the attorney all those years and later in life becoming a Master Gardener. The pictures you sent of your Volkswagen all beautifully painted with flowers and bees and a flower for the antennae... And how much fun you had when the city hired you to do a landscape. We could still visit each other when Mick and I moved to Mountain Home, Ark. Remember the shrimp fiasco? The four of us travelled to Louisiana, was it? To buy all that shrimp... Remember Red borrowing Mick's ladder and us moving off and Red ordering a ladder that was shipped to us for the replacement! Then we moved to Oregon. We didn't talk for hours at a time then-that came later when long distance was free. Once when I called from Oregon in the 80's, you talked to me while you were lying flat on the floor because your back hurt. When I visited after one of your back surgeries, I tried to help you by repositioning your legs while you were in the hospital bed at home and it was painful. Remember the lovely doves you raised and the beautiful glass window of doves in a branch that graced your door in Arkansas? You had such an eye for beauty. Remember how Red gave me that antique chair of his mother's? I still use it today at my desk. Five years after Brother Mick had gone to be with the Lord, I married Bud Hinds, my childhood sweetheart. Mother was ill so we had a private service. But when we celebrated our wedding supper a couple of months later, you and Red drove all the way to our hometown in Tennessee t (I'm going to try to put the rest on another page, Judy, it's just like the batteries on our phones going out because we're talking so long!
