Judy Jordan (Willis) passed away in Bryan, TX on May 25th, 2025. She was born on August 29, 1946 to William Alton (W.A.) Willis and Ruby Dean Shields Willis in San Angelo, TX. She spent the majority of her childhood in Levelland, TX. Her family left Levelland in 1961 when her father retired from the U.S. Air Force. The family moved to Odessa, TX, then Abilene where she graduated from Abilene High School in 1964. Judy continued her education at Texas Tech University for 4 years where she began her career in the travel and hospitality sales industry. She was the first female manager for Earl Hayes Rentals at the DFW airport in the 1970's, and had lengthy sales careers with Avis Rentals and Omni hotels, amongst several others.

On August 17th, 1980 she married the love of her life, Kenneth Dean Jordan Sr. They lived the majority of their life in San Antonio, TX and were married 25 years until his death in 2005. Judy was an avid golfer and gardener, loved to sing Patsy Cline music, and made a mean pot of chili!
