Judy Lee Montgomery Soignet Wesack was born in Kansas on Dec 21, 1952. She passed away peacefully on May 25, 2021, after a short illness.

Judy was preceded in death by her mother Martha Lucille Treg, her father Robert Montgomery, and her younger sister Bonnie. Judy is survived by her devoted sister Jacqueline Tregre, and her two wonderful children, Melissa Bartley and her husband Gordon, and Chris Soignet and his wife Lisa. She is survived by her beloved grandchildren Tyler, Fiona, Ryan and Lucy and her great granddaughter Harmony. She is also survived by dozens of Women in Recovery sisters and her Spiritual Director Jo Jo Perales.

Born into an army family, she lived in many different places, including Germany four different times. In 1970 she joined the Women's Army Corps and completed training as an operating room nurse. She met and married soldier Clarence Soignet, and left military service per the rules of that time. They had two children, Melissa and Chris. She later married Paul Wesack and was eventually widowed. She came to San Antonio and found her permanent home there.

Judy's life changed forever when she found sobriety on Jan 10 of 2000. She "discovered a new employer", God, and spent the rest of her life helping countless others overcome addiction and alcoholism. She lived her life as an example to others and had a deep love and respect for the program of AA.

Judy was sponsor to many women and had many sponsees. She also believed strongly in having a sponsor herself and was active in her AA

program.

Judy was a retreatant on the first Women in Recovery ACTS retreat in 2007 and was the only woman to serve on every retreat since. She served as Co Director several times and was also Director as well as serving on the board for WIR ACTS currently. She was well known in the ACTS community and the recovery community for her wisdom, positive attitude, calm demeanor, infectious smile and sense of humor. Judy was also a great supporter of the Men's Recovery ACTS and spent hours making meals, attending events, raising funds and helping out in any way she was asked.

She had friends from many different places and loved her work crew where she was a bookkeeper. She shared her great talent for cooking with friends and family and gave cooking lessons to close friends. Judy loved plants, was a voracious reader, and was known to zipline. She was a fun loving person ready for the next adventure, but also always ready to sit and listen and give comfort as well.

As a grandma, mom and sister, Judy was selfless, generous and loving. Any grandchild of hers was sure to receive her acceptance, love and wisdom. She loved to share photos and stories of their lives and accomplishments with friends, and was so proud of each of them. Spending time with her family was precious to her and brought her great joy.

As an Army veteran, Judy was always a strong supporter of our US military and was so proud of her family's military service, especially that of her son and sister.

Judy was a woman of great faith and was a devoted converted Catholic. She served as a Eucharistic Minister for years at both St. Mark the Evangelist and then Blessed Sacrament. She loved attending Mass, the Rosary and the Divine Mercy Chaplet. She believed in eternal life through Jesus Christ and her friends and family find comfort that we will all see her again someday, whole, healthy and perfect.

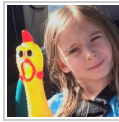
