Born June the 11th of 1940 in Munday Texas, June “Penny” Clair Hutcheson – Rankin- Schulz-McCombs of San Antonio Texas passed peacefully Saturday October 12th 2019. She was the daughter of Douglas Vernon and Ora Lee (Floyd) Hutcheson and sister to Jo Ann and Randy.

She is survived by her two Sons and their families, Gary and Tammy Rankin and Steve and Kay Lynn Schulz and grandsons Sterling and Mason.

Her sense of pride and lack of wanting to saddle or sadden anyone else with her burden, she kept her battle with cancer a private affair. After over a year of winning the fight using alternative methods, a lung tumor finally became enlarged enough interfere with normal bodily functions. Simply swallowing became difficult enough for her to finally chose to pursue more aggressive treatments. These were met with limited success and the disease ultimately caused her body to succumb to the pressure and brought her full and joyful life to an end. employment agency where she was adorned the nick name “Penny”. A name that would stick with her for her lifetime.

She married and had her two sons before launching what would become her ultimate career in the property management business. June took the job of assistant manager for an apartment complex on the Southside of San Antonio while it was still under construction. Within a year she was promoted to Manager, then within a few short years became the District Manager for around 13 additional apartment complexes. She was admired by all that worked for and with her and was considered to be “The Best” by her superiors and was sent all over the country to train others.

Family was always a priority in June’s life. When the extended family came together for holidays and reunions, they played a simple board game called “Buttons”. As partners, June and her sister Jo Ann took pride in being seated at the winning table the majority of the time.

Country & Western music was her favorite and she was known as one of the best on the dance floor. She enjoyed teaching others to dance and how to do “The Whip” and the Cotton-Eyed-Joe as well as others.

June was married 3 times and had two sons, Gary with her first husband Leroy Rankin and Steve with her second husband Doug Schulz. Her third marriage was to Gerald “Peanut” McCombs which did not produce any children, but spawned her love for salt water fishing. As a young woman her two sons were her pride and joy and she devoted her life to raising them as a single mom. As a result, she raised two sons that she was as proud of their accomplishments as they were hers. Ultimately, she was rewarded with and thoroughly enjoyed two grandsons, which became her favorite way to spend her time in her golden years as “Grandy” to the boys.

June retired in May of 2009 on her small ranchette south of town where she

enjoyed the country life and peacefulness of country living. She also enjoyed fishing and gardening/landscaping and mowing on her favorite vehicle – a 1982 Kubota lawn tractor. She had a 4 legged “son” in the form of a huge 120 lb Doberman she called Sledge.

She joined the Southside Baptist Church in 2017 where she became close friends with and loved Brother Byrom Albert and his wife Judy. Not only did she enjoy the services, but also looked forward to going to Sunday lunch with sister-in-law Jeanine Hutcheson.

June was “mom” to many other’s as well. She was very close to her sister, Jo Ann’s, and her 4 daughters and son, Cheryl, Cheri, Cindy, Rusty and Caryn and their children. She considered her nephew Chad and his wife, Kim and son, Ryan, to be her own. She also enjoyed her brother’s other son, her nephew Garrett and his family. She had a hand in raising a few dozen others over the years and loved them all dearly.
