Junior Allen Jeffrey, age 85, entered into rest on December 26, 2005. He was born in Decatur, Illinois on September 8, 1920, the second child of John Arthur and Helen Copeland Jeffrey. He was predeceased by his sister, Violet Patsy Lee Jeffrey in 1938. Junior Bud was a member of St. Marks United Methodist Church. He is survived by his beloved and devoted wife of 58 years, Lois Peebles Jeffrey, and sisters Mary Elaine Jenkins, Betty Jane Pfeiffer, Bonnie Lane Fuller and husband Tommy, all of San Antonio, and sister-in-law, Lucille Anderson of Lufkin, Texas. He returned in January of 1944 and joined the U.S. Marine Corps where he proudly served his country during WWII. Upon his Honorable Discharge in 1946, he returned to San Antonio and completed and retired from 37 years of dedicated Civil Service at Kelly Air Force Base. He will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him.
