She was also there to encourage and give advice. In addition to being the best big sister and aunt, she was a good friend. She nurtured her relationships with life-long friends who knew her to be genuine and caring.

Later in her life, Karen met and married Jim. Together, they raised a grandchild whom she adored. They hosted many family gatherings in her small home that she had beautifully decorated. Interior decor was one of her many talents.

Karen was also exceptionally talented in billiards. She could run the pool table, sweeping her opponent before they ever had a chance to take a shot. In her early days, Karen played softball in a women's slow pitch league. Karen was known for her love of the beach. The Texas coast was her favorite vacation destination. She would set a chair in the sand near the water and feel the waves roll in. It was her paradise.

Karen had a charitable heart. She gave her time to worthy causes such as the Veterans of Foreign Wars, especially, VFW 8936, that her father founded and where she was active with the ladies auxiliary and served as President. 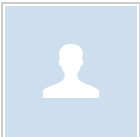
