Karl Edward Riemann Jr., 68, went to be with the Lord on May 18, 2017. He was born in San Antonio, Texas to Karl Riemann and Cleora Belle (Skinner) Riemann on July 21, 1948.

Karl enlisted in the United States Navy and served during the Vietnam conflict, after which he was awarded The Purple Heart. After returning home he worked the remainder of his career in various sales positions revolving around the construction industry. In the approximately 40 years Karl worked in and around the construction industry he acquired a wealth of knowledge that led to the formation of Tollari Construction in 2014. At the time of Karl's death he and Mike Tollari had just completed a 500 square foot addition to a home. This addition could be considered the crown jewel of his achievements in drafting and design. His work on this final project resulted in a level of self-fulfillment he had been missing for so many years. We can confidently say that he left this Earth a happy and successful man.

Karl was a very talented artist and leaves us with numerous original pieces that we will enjoy for years to come. Karl was a proud member of the NRA, loved to exercise, and absolutely adored animals of all shapes and sizes. He leaves behind 5 beloved cats: Reilly, Mallow, Ebby, Bitsy, and Mamacita.

Karl is preceded in death by his parents and his brother John William

Riemann. Karl is survived by his beloved wife of 19 years, Molly (Hatzembuehler) Riemann; cousins, Carolyn Rook and Evan Oney; step-sister, Gloria Young; lifetime friends, Jeff and Sue Barrett, and Bill, Jesse, and Jeanie Johnson; business partner, Mike Tollari, and a host of other dear friends too numerous to mention.
