Katrina passed away on October 19, 2021 in San Antonio, Texas at the age of 35 years old, after a courageous battle with bladder cancer.

Katrina was born in San Antonio on November 12, 1985 to Joanna Culver. She graduated from Highlands High School in 2004 and developed her photographic talents by helping work on the yearbook. She attended San Antonio College where she studied Interior/Graphic Design and Computer Aided Drafting. She designed and sold handmade jewelry and decorative items on her own Etsy store, and was developing a crafting blog at the time of her death.

Katrina would describe herself as a full-time professional craft extraordinaire, puppy enthusiast and reluctant workaholic. Katrina was "easily distracted by dogs", and would often take selfies with new dogs she met.

Katrina is survived by her mother Joanna Culver and her dog Turtle, as well as her aunt Holly and uncle Mark, cousins Bobby, Gerry and Sarah Retzloff. She was preceded in death by her grandma Ada Culver and granddaddy

Robert Culver. The family would like to thank those who assisted in her care, especially Miss Connie and Aunt Dawnie.
