It was calming to the both of us. I remember a few times when he'd made things I think in either a school or vocational program. It has been years and I haven't got as good memory as I used to. But I do remember him making things and being quite proud of them. He was always so quiet.. at least back then. But he was also very polite.. respectful. Just a really nice young guy at the time. He wasn't "too friendly" to the point of making me feel uncomfortable. I was very shy back then. He was the right kind of friendly .. welcoming without being "in your face". He was always able to share a comfortable silence. When he did talk .. he had real things to say. I felt safe on our walks .. and safety was something that was in short supply sometimes for me back then. So I am extra thankful for who he was .. as well as what of himself he shared with me. I don't know if we had a "friendship" .. or if we had a "common bond". But what ever it was .. it was nice. I am very sorry for the family and also for local friends. I hadn't seen Kelly in many years and it hurts to find out he has passed. So I know it has to be crushing his local friends.. and especially his family.
