Kim Quan Ng, born in San Antonio, Texas on August 22, 1930, went peacefully to the arms of the Lord on January 1, 2020 at the age of 89. She studied at Our Lady of the Lake University, worked at Kelly Air Force Base and was married for 63 yrs. Before the invention of the TV, one of the highlights of her life was singing with her husband on the radio the popular song “In the Garden”. Her warm smile brightened the room and her gentle spirit brought peace to all those she encountered. She was willing to explore technology: Facebook, Alexa, her tablet and Netflix— all in her later years.

She also was a devoted children’s Sunday School teacher and church nursery director. Her love of children continued in her career with YMCA after school care at elementary schools. Her love of crafting, gardening, reading and sewing filled her spare time.
