Kyle Allen Fuller was born May 17, 1997, in San Antonio, Texas and went to be with his Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ on November 25, 2019. Kyle was a passionate competitor in everything he participated in from a very

early age. Beginning in elementary school, he won the bike rodeo at Coker Elementary four out of five years and even placed second in the city in fourth grade. He was also active in soccer, basketball and baseball at a young age, being named to the McAllister Park Little League All-Stars several times as a catcher. Kyle's first love was always football, where he also excelled at a young age, earning Academic All-American honors in Pop Warner Football in sixth grade for which he was invited to the national convention. He continued to excel in football, basketball and track at Bradley Middle School, where he also played the violin in the school orchestra.

As Kyle was developing his athletic skills from a very young age he also diligently applied himself in the classroom and excelled as a student. In elementary school he received the NEISD Superintendent's Award in fifth grade at Coker Elementary. At Bradley Middle School he was a member of the National Junior Honor Society and a recipient of the President's Award for Academic Excellence. He excelled in math and science in middle school which helped him earn admission to the STEM program at Robert E. Lee High School.

As a student at Robert E. Lee High School's STEM program Kyle's obvious intellectual talents continued to flourish. He continued his academic excellence as a member of the National Honor Society, the National Spanish Honor Society, a member of the Academic All-State Team and graduated Summa Cum Laude from STEM in 2016. The only area where he surpassed these impressive classroom achievements was on the football field.

As a Junior in 2014, Kyle became the starting quarterback at Robert E. Lee High School and immediately distinguished himself as a field general with his precision passing, gutsy running, ability to read defenses and mastery of Coach Danny Kloza's complex passing offense. For his efforts that season Kyle was named first-team District 27 6A and second team all city in San

Antonio. He also earned ESPN's Player of the Week Award, several other accolades and broke virtually every school single season passing record including passes attempted, completions, yardage and touchdowns. Following his junior year he was invited to participate in the Nike Football Camp in Eugene, Oregon.

During his Senior season as the Volunteers' quarterback Kyle continued his record setting pace and was again named ESPN's Player of the Week, was named second-team all-district and Academic All-State. Most importantly, his leadership on and off the field helped the Vols secure their first winning season in over 20 years with a 6-4 record, missing the playoffs by only one game. After getting looks from several major college programs, Kyle accepted a football scholarship to Navarro Junior College in Corsicana, Texas where he starred for two years. After his stint at Navarro JC he accepted a football scholarship to Incarnate Word University in his hometown of San Antonio where he majored in Computer Science.

But beyond all of his accomplishments on the football field and in the classroom, Kyle will be best remembered as a kind and caring young man with a strong faith, deep spirituality and a compassionate heart. If you ever looked at his Facebook page you saw three simple words God, Family, Football. On his Instagram and his Twitter accounts he had Proverbs 3:5-6 as his calling card - "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths."

As much as Kyle loved to compete and excel to be the very best at every task he undertook, he was never one to flaunt his achievements, always maintaining a humble spirit with a sensitivity for the less gifted and less fortunate.

Very rare was the occasion when Kyle didn't have a smile on his face, a smile that lit up any room he walked into and drew people to him. He commanded the respect of his peers and the admiration of his elders. In his very large extended family he was loved especially by his younger cousins who competed for his attention and affection. He had many lifelong friends, but he had the ability to make even a casual acquaintance feel a sense of connection to him.

Whether you knew him from Coker Elementary, Bradley Middle School, MacArthur, Churchill or Robert E. Lee High School, Navarro or Incarnate Word - if you were fortunate enough to have your life intersect with his, you are no doubt a better person for it. And Kyle, being who he was, learned from you as well. For Kyle, kindness was always reciprocated.

We grieve deeply because Kyle is no longer with us in this life. The void that he has left is real and tangible. He was on a trajectory to certainly make his mark in the world in whatever field he would have chosen as a profession and in any interests he would have pursued. His passing leaves us with so many questions, but in the midst of our grief and pain we have the assurance that what scripture says is true, because we are "persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other thing in all of creation, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."
(Romans 8:38-39)

Kyle has been separated from us, but he has not been separated from God. Because of that, even though we grieve, we do not grieve as those who have no hope, because our hope is secure in the fact that Jesus Christ has conquered death and through him we have been made "more than conquerors through Him who loved us." (Romans 8:37) There is coming a day

when “God will wipe away every tear from our eyes; there will be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying and there will be no more pain.” (Revelation 21:4) This is our faith and in this we take comfort. In that day when all things are made new, we will see Kyle again.

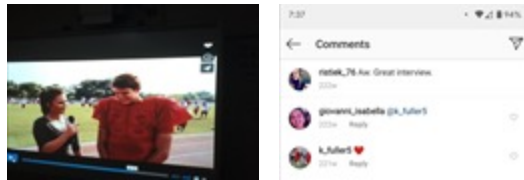

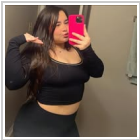
