Lawrence L. Caldwell, born in Saltsburg, PA was 98 years old when he died in San Antonio, Tx. He trained as a pilot during WWII, then joined the Pennsylvania National Guard after the war to continue flying, which he loved. He drove bus until changing to the US Civil Service, relocating his family from Harrisburg, PA to Military City, San Antonio, in 1961 when the government closed the PA base. He also transferred to the TX Army National Guard for helicopter training.

Larry eventually retired from both Civil Service and the Guard to enjoy traveling with his wife. He also had a small business repairing air conditioning for several apartment complexes.

He was a devoted husband and father, caring for his wife in her declining years, then later moving in with his daughters. He attended Los Angeles Heights Presbyterian Church in his later years.

Known as Leonard or Ted in Pennsylvania, and affectionately as Neighbor to his late wife's family, Larry was predeceased by parents, Samuel & Irma May Caldwell, brother & wife, Samuel Maurice and Ethel Caldwell, wife Julia Caldwell, and step-daughter, Toni Krause Langson.

He is survived by children John (Anita) Caldwell of CO, Kathleen Caldwell & Jacqueline Granados of San Antonio; granddaughter Sandra (Preston) Coldewey and children Lorelei, Gillian and Miles of Bulverde; by cousin Irma Bortz McDivitt, nephews Lawrence and James Caldwell, niece Patricia Shutt and their families in PA; by stepson Mike Krause in AZ; and by his late wife's

grandchildren, Ninette Goucher, Julie Cowan and Shelley Plaut and their families in NV and ID.
