



## Lawrence (Larry) Lorenzo Larson

Lawrence (Larry) Lorenzo Larson, born June 20, 1956, in San Francisco, California, passed away peacefully on July 9, 2024, at Audie L. Murphy VA Hospital in San Antonio, TX. He was the son of Pearl Lenola Dale and Clardon Euray Larson.

Larry spent the bulk of his childhood in Granger, Utah, where he developed a love for the mountains, fishing, and hunting. At 17, he enlisted in the Army, proudly serving in the 82nd Airborne Division and the Presidential Guard, which profoundly shaped his character and instilled in him values of duty, courage, and patriotism.

Gifted with intellect and a curious mind, Larry pursued many interests throughout his life. He was widely respected for his skill in leatherworking, owning and operating his own successful business.
