



## Lawrence S. Mollere

February 15, 1919 - April 18, 2009

Lawrence S. Mollere, was born 1919 in Donaldsonville LA. Along with his parents Camilla and Edmund Mollere he and his and three siblings; Leonard Mollere, Agnes Thoms, and Elsie Rauschuber, moved to San Antonio. Lawrence began a fruit stand on South Flores which later became the first of his two grocery stores; Deluxe Supermarket. Throughout his business career Lawrence Mollere played an important part in the continued development of Southside business. Lawrence expanded his business into ranching in the early 70's with Deluxe Cattle Company. Deluxe Supermarkets became synonymous for fresh quality meat and meat products.

In 1949 Lawrence married Virginia Peavler. By his side for 60 years they raised three children; Lawrence Larry , Annette and Michael. Together they built a life rich with friends and family. Lawrence Mollere was a devoted Catholic, and supporter of St. Leo's, St. Teresa's and St Margret Mary's Church.

At 90 years of age, Lawrence Mollere died April 18, 2009. He is survived by; his wife, Virginia Mollere, two children Annette and Michael Mollere, granddaughters; Weslie, Chardae and Ali Mollere, and son-in law James Rodriguez. He was preceded in death by his oldest son Larry Mollere.
