Bud held several positions while working for the Treasury Department, Bud loved working for the NTEU employee union. Bud coordinated a picket line for better wages and he took Suzanne with him, she was 3 years old. Bud learned Braille and was responsible for the implementation and creation of braille forms for the Treasury Department.

Bud retired from the U.S. Treasury Department in 2008 and enjoyed spending time at home taking naps. Bud spent a lot of time riding his motorcycle and visited most states. Bud loved spending time with his grandchildren.
