Leonard Frank Ullmann, age 83, joined those who've already entered Heaven, on Tuesday, June 2, 2020; the pain and suffering have ceased and he has now found comfort and peace in our Lord's embrace. He was born April 29, 1937, in Floresville, Texas, to Joseph and Ernestine Ullmann. A graduate of St. Gerard's High School, he immediately found gainful employment in warehousing at McKesson-Robbins Medical Supplies, where he worked for over twenty years. Before retiring, he was employed at Grocery Supply Company in warehousing and product delivery.

A member of the St. Joseph's Society, he was an avid 10-pin and 9-pin bowler, part of teams that won league championships throughout the late 1960s and most of the 1970s. He enjoyed participating in the annual Texas Ten Pin tournaments in such places as Galveston, Schulenberg, and the former Turner Social Club.

A dedicated parishioner of 57 years at Holy Name Catholic Church, he would attend 10:30am Mass on Sundays to ensure he didn't miss the noon kickoff if the Dallas Cowboys were playing that day. As their "undisclosed" assistant coach, he was ready and willing to point out their mistakes from the comfort of his own recliner. He also enjoyed watching the San Antonio Spurs, either in person or on television, being a supportive fan through bad seasons and championships since the team arrived from Dallas in 1967.

Dad, Leo, Pop, and PaPa also enjoyed annual cruises and vacations in Port Aransas with his family. With his radio in one hand and a Miller Lite in the other, he cherished full days at the beach, but at the same time, couldn't wait to be home with his dogs. He also took pride in knowing when the next thunderstorm would arrive well before any weatherman or radar system did.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Carole; daughters Patti, Kellie, Rhonda, and Donna; sons Scott and Brett; sons-in-law Thomas Lindsey, Michael Miller, and Ty Young; daughter-in-law, Ashley; granddaughters Taylor, Madison, Danielle, and Elise; grandsons Nicholas, Michael, Bennett, Tyler, Bryce, Sean, and Blake.
