Leopoldo Miera Jr., 73, of San Antonio passed Monday, December 26, 2016 at University Hospital. Rosary will be held on 1/08/2017 at 7:00 p.m. at Mission Park North Funeral Chapels, Cherry Ridge, 3401 Cherry Ridge, San Antonio, Texas 78230. Funeral service will be held on 01/09/2017 at noon at the same Mission Park Funeral chapel. Burial service will follow at 1:30 p.m. at Fort Sam Houston cemetery.

Leo was born on Jan 29, 1943 in San Antonio to Anita R. Miera and Leopoldo Miera Sr. He graduated from Lanier High School in San Antonio. He answered the call to Vietnam and served as an intelligence analyst until he was honorably discharged and returned home to provide care for his Mother. He worked at the Brady Green Hospital in admissions until he began to work at Kelly Air force Base as an inspector. He retired in 2000 with governmental recognition of his service of 24 years. Following his retirement he started working as a substitute teacher at SAISD until his passing. In 2008, he joined his friend working part-time at Fort Sam Houston in the student activity center. Leo married Shuet-Mei Cheung on Dec. 28, 1985 in both Hong Kong and the United States.

He is survived by his wife of 31 years, Shuet-Mei Miera and son, Kyle Miera, sisters-in-law, brothers-in-law, cousins, nephews and nieces, grand-nephews and grand-nieces.
