Faith was at the center of his life. He was a member of St. Benedict Catholic Church and a devoted member of the church's alter society. He found joy in serving others through his faith, often bringing the Body of Christ to parishioners who were homebound, ensuring they felt connected and loved by their church community.

Family was everything to him. He was a devoted husband, a loving father, and a proud grandfather. He adored his grandchildren and found joy in every moment spent with them, whether through shared laughter, family vacations, or simply showing up— something he never failed to do.

He had a servant's heart. Acts of service were his love language. If someone needed help, he was already there. He found happiness in giving, especially when it came to gifts—there was nothing he loved more than watching someone's face light up as they opened something he had thoughtfully chosen. He cherished making memories, traveling with his family, fishing in peaceful moments, and living life fully and generously.

Above all, He loved his wife, family, community, and the Lord deeply. His faith guided his life, actions, and the way he treated others.

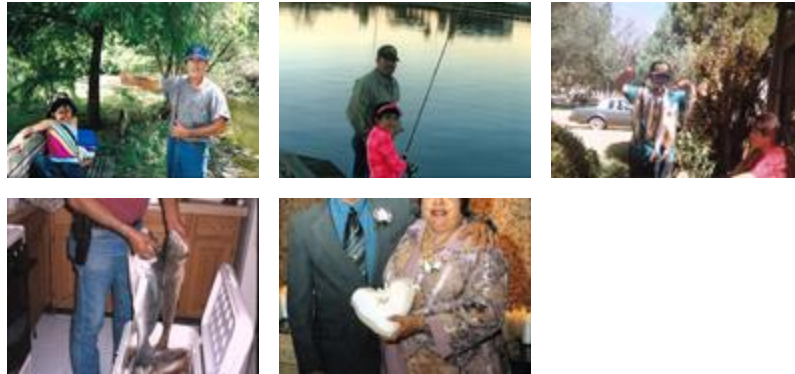
