She was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Ted; her parents; and many dear aunts, uncles, relatives, and lifelong friends. Though she will be deeply missed, the thought of her reunion with loved ones in Heaven brings comfort to those who mourn her passing. Truly, Heaven has gained a treasured soul.

Lillian is survived by her beloved adopted granddaughters, Giavanna and Isabella, who were the pride of her heart; her nieces, Mardel and Lauri Fehrenbach; her nephews, Nikolaus and Charles Fehrenbach; her godson, Maverick Fisher; and her cherished cat, Simon. She also leaves behind

Those who knew Lillian will remember her warm smile, quick wit, and steadfast loyalty. She deeply valued her friendships and family, always treasuring the connections that enriched her life.

Twelve years ago, Lillian suffered a stroke, yet she continued to live a full and purposeful life, thanks in large part to the devoted care and companionship of Rochelle and Stephen. Their love and dedication were a blessing, and the family is forever grateful for their presence in her life.
