



## Lily Ng Lee

April 4, 1960 - August 26, 2021

Lily Ng Lee was born on April 4, 1960 to William Ng and Jean Louis in Austin, TX, and entered into eternal life with Christ at age 61, on August 26, 2021 from her home in San Antonio, TX.

After spending her formative days growing up between Austin and Bayside, Queens, Lily attended the University of Texas at Austin, where she earned her Bachelor of Science degree to practice Pharmacy. Through a school internship, she came to San Antonio, where she met John at First Chinese Baptist Church. She was married to her husband, John Lee, after more than two years of dating.

After they got married, Lily and John moved to Dallas so he could finish his seminary degree. In 1989, they relocated to Miami, FL to serve at the Chinese Baptist Church of Miami. There, God blessed them with two sons, Joshua and Daniel. Throughout their time in Miami, Lily served as the rock for the family and spent lots of time both as teacher and driver: homeschooling Josh and Daniel and then shuttling the boys to their various extracurricular activities for nearly 10 years. She actively helped both sons earn their Eagle Scout rank.

In 2011, the family transitioned to San Antonio so Lily's husband could return home and assume pastoral duties at First Chinese Baptist Church. Lily was actively involved with her church and regularly volunteered at FCBC, using

her gift of teaching children about Jesus through arts & crafts. She loved crafting, creating, and baking--there was never a time when she wasn't in the midst of a project.

In the summer of 2016, Lily was diagnosed with an aggressive form of breast cancer, which was treated over the following months. In December of 2016, she received a second, completely separate breast cancer diagnosis. This led to a double mastectomy in January 2017, followed by 30 rounds of radiation. In April of 2018, Lily received the devastating news that her cancer had returned, this time as stage 4 metastatic breast cancer, or MBC. In 2019, she received another discouraging diagnosis that the cancer had spread to her brain. While whole brain radiation was successful in shrinking the tumors, one grew back in the summer of 2021, ultimately leading to her passing. Throughout her battle with cancer, she remained upbeat and courageous, knowing God has promised better and greater things for her because of her unwavering faith in the resurrected Jesus Christ.

Lily abruptly passed away on August 26, 2021 in her home surrounded by loved ones after a 5 year battle with metastatic breast cancer.

Lily was preceded in death by her parents. She is survived by her husband of 35 years, John, and her two children: Josh and his wife Meagan, and Daniel; her sister Beverly (Brien), her brother Wallace (Kristi), her sister Ann (Dave), her brother John Dale, and her beloved nephews and nieces.
