



Linda Anne Ewing

January 9, 1948 - June 27, 2008

Linda Anne Lewis Ewing passed away on June 27th, 2008 at the age of 60. Linda was born in Dallas but came to San Antonio at a young age, graduating from Lee in 1966. She attended Trinity University while supporting herself by working as a clothes buyer at Joske's. At Trinity, she found geology as a profession, then finished her degree in 1971 at New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology in Socorro. She then worked in Houston, first for Conoco, then for Mobil Oil where she was trained as a geophysicist and explored the Gulf of Mexico for oil and gas. After working at Mesa Petroleum for a short while, she returned to San Antonio in 1980 and a year later 'set out her shingle' as a consulting geophysicist. She married Dr. Thomas E. Ewing in 1984, and he joined her 'family enterprise'. Together they built Frontera Exploration Consultants, and hosted one of the first computer seismic workstations in San Antonio. She retired just last year, nine years into her struggle with breast cancer. Linda loved music and faithfully attended the San Antonio Opera. She participated in the music of the San Antonio Liederkrantz as director's spouse and associate member. In later years, Linda was an avid quilter and a lover of fine fabrics. She also supported the Hill Country Youth Ranch, which gives a home to abused children. With her husband, she joined the Catholic Church in 2006 and became devoted to the Blessed Virgin and to St. Anne. She is preceded in death by her father William Frank Lewis. She is survived by her mother, Betty Byrd Brown Lewis, her brother William Robert Lewis, her husband Dr. Thomas Edward Ewing, her daughter Christina Anne

Ewing-Gromoll and her son-in-law Bernd Gromoll and his sons Ole and Max, numerous cousins, and four cats.
