She also worked part-time gigs with Bill Millers Catering, Fresh Horizons Catering and catered many events "Just for Friends" with her

good friend Genny Kraus. After retiring from the catering business, she actively involved herself in her grandchildren's activities which she enjoyed immensely. She also regularly volunteered at the Crestholme Presbyterian Church food pantry until her health began to fail.

Her proudest moment was when she was featured on an episode of the TV show What Would You Do? Hosted by John Quinones, where she was caught on camera offering assistance to a veteran who could not pay for his groceries at a local LaFiesta grocery store.

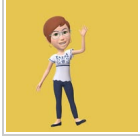
