



Lloyd E. Deuel, Sr.

October 17, 1918 - December 16, 2004

M/Sgt Lloyd E Deuel, Sr. USAF ret, went to the Lord on December 16, 2004 at the age of 86. Born in Bakersfield California on October 17th, 1918 to JJ and Mary Deuel, he joined the Army Air Corp in June of 1941 to earn extra money to further his education. Pearl Harbor changed his plans and after being extended "for the duration". He decided to make it a career. He was the first Sergeant for several thousand soldiers in the Pacific theater serving at Eniwetok and Kwajalien in island hopping march to Japan. After the war he joined the Air Force and helped establish the Cryptographic service with the Security Service in San Antonio. He was a pioneer in using computers for code making and breaking. After retiring from active duty in 1961 he worked for the Headquarters, USAF Security Service for 27 years in the Civil Service. He is survived by his loving wife of 62 years Anna Anderson Deuel, brothers William of Arizona, Glen of California; sister, Leah of California; daughter Mary Hall of Arizona, Sons Lloyd Jr. and wife Vickie, Charles and wife Yoko, Leslie and wife Eleanor, and James; 11 grandchildren, 24 great grandchildren;
