Londerien Gentry Hiser passed away peacefully at Northeast Baptist Hospital at the age of 95, following a brief illness.

They shared a mutual need for each other, and for the next 17 years she loved and nurtured her 2nd family. In fact, she always referred to Tim and Michael as "her boys". Londerien was a great cook, who baked the best bread, and made irresistible pies. She was happiest when the family was around to enjoy her

cooking. She was also a very talented seamstress whose hands were always busy. Londerien loved sewing for people, and she was always giving to someone. She also loved to write, and in fact, she composed a poem for all of her many grandchildren.

Above all she took great joy in her relationship and devotion to her faith in Jesus Christ. It bothered her when her vision failed and she could no longer cook and sew, but it truly grieved her when she could no longer read her bible. She faithfully served in her church for many years, and she especially enjoyed working with the young women. She enjoyed teaching them to cook and other life skills. They all loved her, because they knew she loved them. Londerien spent the last 4 years on Hospice care at Regent Care of Oakwell Farms where she was a joy to everyone.

From her birth to her death she nourished people around her with her love, faith, and service. Her life was a living example of one of her favorite Bible verses, Ephesians 4:32—"And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you." The night she died, she told Clara she should go home to take care of the dogs. She said, "It's Ok, Jesus is here". Those of us that knew her have little doubt that He was there to take her home.
