



## Lt. Col Henry V. Sienkiewicz USAF Ret.

May 24, 1924 - July 19, 2007

Lt. Col. Henry V. Sienkiewicz, USAF Ret. passed away Thursday, July 19, 2007 at the age of 83. His military career spanned 32 years prior to his retirement in 1975. In 1962 he was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for his participation in the Persian Rug Operation that was in flight for 21 hours and 52 minutes, covering 12, 519 miles and set 11 international records. In 1973 he was awarded a Special Medal of Honor from the Korean Government for his efforts in the rescue and recovery operation during the severe flooding in that country. He is survived by his wife of 56 years, Elizabeth “Betty” Sienkiewicz; daughters, Lucia Jameson and husband Tom, and Meta Sienkiewicz; sons, Raymond Sienkiewicz and wife Sook, Michael Sienkiewicz and wife Zelma, and Robert Sienkiewicz and his partner Freddie Borders; sister, Cecelia Susan Malesic; brother, Mark Sienkiewicz; 6 grandchildren; and 1 great grandchild.

Visitation will be from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm Tuesday, July 24, 2007 at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North. On Wednesday, July 25, 2007 visitation will begin at 11:30 am at St. Vincent De Paul Catholic Church, with a Rosary at 12:30 pm followed by Funeral Mass. Interment will follow in Ft. Sam Houston National Cemetery with full Military Honors.
