



## Lt. Col. Hugh Vaughn McBride

Lt. Col. Hugh V. McBride, USAF, Retired, was born on October 15, 1920 to Earl and Nellie McBride on a farm near May, Texas, just north of Brownwood, Texas. He passed away on January 22, 2011 at his home in San Antonio, with his family by his side. After graduation, he joined the Army Air Force, which we know today as the USAF, where he served 24 years during WWII, saw 3 years in the European Theater and received several medals. After returning to the states he saw duty in Hawaii and several other states. Upon retiring from the Air Force, he worked Civil Service for several years, from there he and his family began traveling, taking them to beautiful states they hadn't seen before. He had a love for genealogy, researching both sides of his and his wife's family, which he put into a "Book of Remembrance", which was quite a gift to leave his family. Mr. McBride was a member of St. Luke's Catholic Church and will be fondly missed by all, including his constant and loving Little Lizzy, his pet Jack Russell. One day, while walking, a man asked him "What is your dog's name"?, and his reply was, "she is not a dog, her name is Lizzy". Mr. McBride was preceded in death by his parents; his sisters, Wilma Brown and Venita Lawrence; brother, Cloyce McBride; and grandson, Wesley Earl McBride. He is survived by his loving wife of 69 years, Violet Stacey McBride; and his son, Randolph "Randy" McBride.
