Lt. Col. Wallace Borden, USAF Retired died September 22, 2010 after a long illness. He was born Jan, 26, 1920 in Fall River, MA, the second child of the late Fredrick Borden and Edith Parker Borden. He married Florence Poole on Aug 22, 1942. He entered the Army Air Corps in 1943, where he was trained to be a navigator. He spent a total of 28 years in the Air Force, flying as a navigator on bombers, overseeing aircraft maintenance, and serving as a missile crew commander. He retired in 1971 and settled in San Antonio. He became a Mason in 1958 while stationed in Japan, and has been a member of the Charles W. Anderson Lodge #1413 in San Antonio and the Alzafar Shrine, and was a Sojourner. He was a member of the Air Force Association, American Legion, Military Officers Association of America, San Antonio Reserve Officers Association, Association of Air Force Missileers, and Disabled American Veterans. He is survived by his loving wife of 68 years, Florence of San Antonio, daughters Sandra Anderson of Allison Park, PA, Donna Otto and her husband Randy of Fairview, TX, son Kenneth Borden of Chesterfield, MO; 6 grandchildren, and 4 great grandchildren. Also his brother Malcolm of Lakeville, MA, and several nieces and nephews. He is preceded in death by his parents and sister, Edith Stevens of North Dighton, MA.
