



Dr. Luis Colisao Junio

December 30, 1925 - February 23, 2017

Dr. Luis Colisao Junio was born in Bayambang, Pangasinan, Philippines to Pedro Junio and Anastacia Colisao on December 30, 1925. He went to be with the Lord on February 23, 2017 in San Antonio, Texas at the age of 91 yrs. old.

He graduated from the University of Santo Tomas in Manila as Doctor of Medicine in 1955. After a few years of Family Practice, he joined the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) retiring as Chief Radiologist of V. Luna Medical Center in 1985 with the rank of Colonel.

After retirement, Dr. Junio continued his practice as Consultant Radiologist of several hospitals in Pampanga and Bulacan provinces.

He was preceded in glory by his wife of 57 years, Consuelo Abalos (2006) and their son Reynaldo (2009)

In 1988, Bro. Luis surrendered his life to Christ, got born again and water baptized. He was an active member of the Golden Harvesters Life Group of Lord of the Harvest Church.

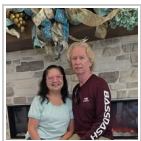
