Lyle Vernon Blasing died peacefully on April 30, 2021, at the age of 92 in Hondo, Texas. He was born November 12, 1928, in North Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. Lyle joined the Air Force (then the Army Air Corp) after high school and served in the Korean and Vietnam wars. While stationed in Alaska, he met and married Catherine Elizabeth Noonan, of Castroville, Texas. After several moves to Colorado and Washington DC, he achieved the rank of Chief Master Sergeant before retiring in 1969 and moving the family to his wife's beloved Texas. He then went on to work for many years at Unisys Corporation and then for Southwest Business Corporation. He was a member of American Legion Post 300 and the historic Quihi Gun Club. Lyle was known for his corny jokes and loved making people laugh. He enjoyed bowling, fishing, gardening and was a life-long fan of the Green Bay Packers. Sundays were mandatory for family and friends for lunch he prepared prior to watching football. Lyle is survived by his wife of 63 years, Elizabeth Blasing; two daughters, Lisa Miller and Leslie Blasing; and three sons, Mark (Cindy), George, and Jerome (Cindy) Blasing, grandchildren, Jared and Joshua Miller and Caroline Blasing. He is further survived by his many nieces and nephews, both in Texas and Wisconsin. Preceding Lyle in death were his parents Vincent Blasing and Cecelia Suda Blasing, step-mother Margaret, his brother

John "Jack" Blasing, and sister and brother in law Ellen and Edward Kant.
