June 6, 1921 - April 7, 2009

TASK

Major Harry J. Task passed away on April 7, 2009 after a prolonged illness. He was born in Marion, Ohio on June 6, 1921. He is survived by his wife of 64 years, Christine Rozell Task; son and daughter-in-law, Dr. H. Lee and Marjorie Task of Tucson, AZ; granddaughter, Christine Marie Task of Bloomington, IN; and son, Kenneth W. Task of Victoria, TX. Major Task was a WWII B-17 pilot, flying daylight raids from Chelveston, England. He retired from the Air Force on January 1, 1968 and managed to mostly avoid wearing a necktie for the rest of his life. After retiring from the Air Force he earned academic degrees from Trinity University and Our Lady of the Lake Warden School of Social Work. He was employed by the Texas Welfare Dept. and later taught at St. Phillips College. He was a member of the Eighth Air Force 305th Bomb Groups Memorial Assn. He was editor for the 305th "Can Do Notes" for nine years. He enjoyed inviting strangers passing his wheelchair to "read my cap" and they responded with an appreciative laugh. He had fun showing children how "I can move your fingers without touching them".
