Manuel "Manny" Borrego who descended from one of the founding families of Texas passed away on April 18, 2008. He was a direct descendant of Don Juan José Vásquez Borrego, who received a fifty-league Spanish Royal Land Grant in 1750 on which he established the Villa de Dolores and the Rancho San Juan del Alamo, the first of the José de Escandón settlements on the north bank of the Rio Grande. Manny was a charter member of the San Antonio Founding Chapter, Order of the Granaderos de Gálvez. He is survived by his loving wife, Lita Borrego; daughter, Bernadette Borrego; son, Mark Borrego and grandchildren, Alex Garcia, Dominic Borrego and Vanessa Garcia.
