Marcus (Moe) L. Frey age 86 of San Antonio went to be with his Heavenly Father on Sunday, March 26, 2017.

He was born in Hoskins, Nebraska on March 18, 1931 to the late Rev. Immanuel Frey and Elizabeth (Janz) Frey. Moe became a child of God through Holy Baptism on Sunday March 22, 1931.

Moe attended Denver South High School and graduated in 1948. He continued his education at The University of Denver with a baseball scholarship. He was then called to duty to serve in the United States Air Force and was a Veteran of the Korean Conflict. Moe then returned to The University of Denver and graduated in 1953 with a Business Degree.

After graduating Moe was employed with Hallmark Cards in Kansas City for 27 years and retired as the Director of Product Marketing in 1982. Moe moved to San Antonio Texas where he and his wife Neva co-owned Frey's Hallmark Shop for 25 years.

Moe was a member of many organizations over the years, including the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod's Coordination Council and Board of Stewardship. He spent 16 years on the Board of Directors for Church Mutual Insurance. Moe also served on Telling the Truth in Love Ministry a team that

outreached the Gospel to Mormons.

Moe had a passion for music, he put his talents to work singing in the church choir. Those who knew him well, loved to hear him sing. Moe loved traveling with Neva and their close friends. Moe's hobbies included golfing and watching football. Moe was a very loving, supportive husband, father and grandfather known as Pop Pop.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Neva (Kattke) Frey. He is survived by his son Marc Frey and wife Donna of Newburg, WI; two Daughters Lindsay Mathis and husband James of San Antonio and Miriam Frey of San Antonio; his seven grandchildren include, Patrick Frey and wife, Alona of Oklahoma City, OK; Margaret, Emily, Rachel, and Sarah Frey of Newburg, WI.
