Maria Imelda Bundick, 85, passed away on Thursday, June 17, 2021 after a brief illness. Maria was born on November 13, 1935 to Eduvijes and Trinidad Sierra (Olvera) in Falfurrias, Texas.

She was a member of Victory Temple for over 30 years, where she worshiped and volunteered several days a week. Maria rarely missed church service and praised the Lord every day.
