I spent the last 2 years taking close care of her by ensuring that she made it to all of her medical appointments as well as seeing to all of her medical needs. I ran errands for her ensuring she had all the food she wanted, she never skipped a meal. She sometimes complained about taking her meds but she did it anyway especially when I sternly insisted. I often got scolded by her about things we disagreed on, I usually gave in and did what she wanted anyway however, she also demonstrated concern when I told her about my personal daily challenges. We had many wonderful moments together and will never forget the mornings we spent drinking coffee as we talked politics and world events, it wasn't hard, our ideas and values aligned perfectly. The thing we most had in common was that we loved talking about her grandchildren, my kids. She really was proud of those boys and she never hesitated to tell everyone. Those who came to visit her often had one thing in common, they said she felt like a mother figure to them and that they felt comfort being there with her. The one thing I regret is that I never told her how much she impacted my life, she raised the women I love and married to be a strong independent woman which translated to raising 3 strong well balanced driven yet respectful sons. She always knew the right things to say when we had any concerns life threw our way. She loved Bella her Pug dog who I acquired for her 7 years ago and now recently inherited. She was an avid student of the Word of God and often prayed the rosary. She was a stern solid figure for those of us who needed one to lean on. She was my Suegra and I will miss her dearly.
